The Little Kyoto of San'in Tsuwano

A castle town with 700 years of history, Tsuwano is a small gem located in the mountains, and is rich with historical sites and beautiful nature. Take a stroll up to the castle ruins sitting on a mountain top, enjoy delicious sweets, and experience the history and culture found within Tsuwano.





The currently inhabited old mining town of Omori-cho and its historic townscape lead the way to Ryugenji Mabu Mine Shaft and the remains of other tunnels that were once used for mining silver. Walking around this World Heritage Site feels like you've gotten in a time machine and traveled back to the Edo Period.

Iwami is famous for its large variety of hot springs that are historically known for holding healing properties and providing beautifying effects to the skin, giving it the name "Bijin no Yu". Each hot spring has its own unique water texture and qualities that are offered, so please take the chance to experience it for yourself!
